



# Let's take action to make a world without poverty!

MDGs (Millennium Development Goals) started in 2000 made differences. For example, compared to 1990, the number of people who lives under extreme poverty has halved, the proportion of undernourished people has decreased from 23.2% to 14.9%, and the mortality rate for children under age 5 dropped from 97 deaths per 1,000 live births to 57. These were achieved by the initiative of wide range of people and organizations like the UN, governments and civil society in attempting to achieve the MDGs.

The STAND UP TAKE ACTION campaign (SUTA) has supported such efforts. SUTA aims to collect people's voices to influence governments' policies so that we can achieve the MDGs. It started in 2006, and more than 170 million people from all over the world have participated in 2009 which set a Guinness World Record. In Japan, 32,600 people have participated in 2013. It's a campaign which everyone can easily participate if you wish to end the poverty and want to make the world better.

## MDGs need to be achieved by 2015

On August 19th, there will be only 500 days left to achieve the goals. However, problems still remain, and it looks quite difficult to achieve all the targets. This year is the last chance to raise our voices through SUTA. Let's send our voices to the leaders of Japan so that all the current targets can be steadily advanced and all the countries can agree to establish new goals, i.e. "Post 2015 Development Agenda (Post MDGs)". We ask you to ticipate in this last SUTA as we are all responsible to bequeath possibilities for better world and future for our children, grand-children and further.

### It's an action making your will visible by using a photo.

Showing your will "end poverty" by taking a photo and register it through the SUTA website. It is a very easy form of international cooperation that you can do anytime, anywhere and with anyone.

### What is MDGs?



"Millennium Development Goals (MDGs)" is the categorized targets aiming to realize a world without poverty by international cooperation. Through the UN Millennium Summit in 2000, the leaders of 189 countries have agreed to achieve the goals by 2015.

Currently, Post MDGs (a new target from 2016 after MDGs) is being developed and becoming at the final stage of inter-governmental discussions. NGOs in the world including "Ugoku/Ugokasu (Global Call to Action against Poverty Japan: GCAP Japan)" are lobbying the Japanese government, politician and so on in order to make the Post MDGs better by delivering public voices to them.

Ask your friends, colleagues, family members etc. to join SUTA. And share the reason and will for the participation with them. (Of course, you can participate by yourself.)



When you stand up, STAND UP saying "STAND UP!" loudly makes you feel good.

Don't forget!

Those of who can't understand Japanese, please send your photo with the information: the date and place of taking photo, the number of people participated, the situation or opportunity the photo was taken, the theme or category of your photo (about the category, see the right box), your comments about MDGs or a world without poverty. We will count the total number of people participated to SUTA then deliver the number and your voices to the Japanese government.



After SUTA, take a step to be a part of solutions. Many people are starting from such TAKE ACTION as volunteering, donating, letting people know about the reality of developing countries via SNS, buying fair trade products, contributing through their own jobs, etc.

### Theme of the photo and photo contest

There are 3 categories you can register your photo: "General", "Local" and "Family" . Any photo can be register to the "General" category. Photos for the "Local" category are required to include something about a local area or a community which is related to people's life. For the "Family" category, take a photo with your children, parents or grandparents, i.e. 2 or 3 generations, expressing your will to break the chain of poverty one generation to another. We will award unique photo prize.
